

Grant L. Iverson, Ph.D.

Dr. Grant Iverson is a Professor in the Faculty of Medicine, Department of Psychiatry at the University of British Columbia. His clinical practice, teaching, and research are predominately in the area of clinical neuropsychology. He is the Director and Principal Investigator of the British Columbia Mental Health and Addiction Services Neuropsychology Outcome Assessment Laboratory.

Dr. Iverson is the Chair for the Canadian Psychological Association Section on Clinical Neuropsychology. He is the Vice Chair for the Policy and Planning Committee of the National Academy of Neuropsychology. This committee is responsible for writing the position papers of the Academy. He serves on the Board of Governors for the International Neuropsychological Society.

Professor Iverson is an active clinical researcher in the areas of neuropsychological assessment, traumatic brain injury, depression, and chronic pain (with more than 160 published articles). He has a longstanding research interest in outcome from sport-related concussion and mild traumatic brain injury in civilians. He is involved in ongoing clinical research with injured athletes, civilians, and veterans.
