

JOSEPH E. PARISI, M.D.

Dr. Joseph E. Parisi is a Consultant in the Department of Laboratory Medicine and Pathology, and Professor of Pathology at Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota. Prior to moving to Mayo Clinic, he served as Chairman of the Department of Neuropathology at the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology in Washington, DC. He previously served in the Army Medical Corps at Ft. Sam Houston Texas, Walter Reed Army Medical Center, and the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology.

Dr. Parisi received his BS from Syracuse University (1968) and his MD from State University of New York Upstate Medical Center (1972). An internship in Straight Surgery at the Hospital University of Pennsylvania (1972-1973) was followed by residency training in Neurosurgery (1973-1977); a residency in Anatomic Pathology (1977-1979), during which he served as Chief Resident (1978-1979); and a fellowship in Neuropathology (1979-1981), all at the State University of New York Upstate Medical Center. He received board certifications from the American Board of Pathology in Anatomic Pathology and Neuropathology in 1983. Dr. Parisi is licensed in Minnesota, Maryland, and New York.

Dr. Parisi has served as President of the American Association of Neuropathologists (2003-2004), along with numerous other leadership roles in that organization. He was honored by the American Association of Neuropathologists with the "Award for Meritorious Contributions to Neuropathology" in 2006 and with a named annual lectureship, the "Teva-Parisi Neuroscience Lecture," in 2007. He has served as Chair of the Neuropathology Committee of the College of American Pathologists (2003-2007) and as a member of numerous professional editorial boards. He is a member of the Neuropathology Test Committee of the American Board of Pathology and the author of over 210 scientific publications and book chapters. Since 1992, he has served as Director of Fellowship Training in Neuropathology at Mayo Clinic. He is a past member of the Scientific Advisory Board for the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology and currently serves as Chair of the Subcommittee for Pathology and Laboratory Services of the Defense Health Board.
