Ms. Bonnie Carroll is currently the National Director of the Tragedy Assistance Program for Survivors, Inc. (TAPS). TAPS is a national non-profit Veterans Service organization addressing the emotional, psychological, and administrative problems that arise from the loss of a loved one in military service to America. Previously, Ms. Carroll has served as the Deputy Senior Advisor for Programs, Ministry of Communications, Coalition Provisional Authority in Baghdad, Iraq (2003-2004); Deputy White House Liaison, Department of Veterans Affairs (2002-2003); Deputy Director, Governor's Office in Anchorage, Alaska (1994); and Chief of Staff, Anchorage District Attorney's Office (1991-1994).

Ms. Carroll attended the Community College of the U.S. Air Force and became a certified paralegal in 1983. She earned her Instructor Certification in Equine Science from Springfield College in 1976 and a BA in Public Administration/Political Science from American University in 1986. Ms. Carroll then completed the Executive Leadership Program at the JFK School of Government, Harvard University in 2003.

Ms. Carroll's military experience includes Chief, Casualty Operation in the United States Air Force Reserve (1991-2001) and Air & Space Operations Air Reserve Component Advisor at the Pentagon (2001-2004).
