

## **David Alan Jobes, PhD, ABPP**

Dr. David Alan Jobes is currently a Professor of Psychology at the Catholic University of America in Washington, DC, a position he has held since 2002. Dr. Jobes earned his BA in Psychology at the University of Colorado in Boulder (1984); his MA in General Psychology at American University in Washington, DC (1984); and his PhD in Clinical Psychology at American University (1988). Dr. Jobes is a Licensed Psychologist in Maryland (1989) and the District of Columbia (1990). He is a Board Certified Clinical Psychologist with the American Board of Professional Psychology (2002).

Dr. Jobes has been published in professional journals, such as the *Journal of Forensic Sciences*, *Suicide and Life-Threatening Behavior*, *Professional Psychology: Research and Practice*, and *Crisis Intervention and Time-Limited Treatment*. His most recent keynote address was at the Tri-State Suicide Prevention Coalition in Covington, KY (2008). The topic was *Youth and Young Adult Suicide: Prevention, Crisis Response, and Postvention*. In 2008, Dr. Jobes was invited to serve on an expert panel assisting the “Veterans Affairs Blue Ribbon Work Group on Suicide Prevention.” He was tasked with making specific recommendations to the Secretary of Veterans Affairs. Dr. Jobes’ professional affiliations include the American Psychological Association, American Association of Suicidology, International Association of Suicide Prevention, and the International Academy for Suicide Research.
