

John E. Neiderhuber, MD

Dr. Neiderhuber is the Director of the National Cancer Institute. His previous administrative and medical appointments include Deputy Director for Translational and Clinical Sciences, Office of the Director, National Cancer Institute, National Institute of Health; Professor, Department of Surgery and Department of Oncology, University of Wisconsin Medical School; and full-time staff at the University of Wisconsin Hospital and Clinics. Dr. Neiderhuber received his BS in chemistry and mathematics from Bethany College (1960) and his MD from Ohio State University Medical School (1964); he completed his internship in surgery at University Hospital in Ohio (1964-1965). His residency in surgery was completed at University Hospital in Michigan (1967-1969), where he also completed NIH academic training in surgery (1969-1970). Dr. Neiderhuber also served as a Visiting Research Fellow in the Division of Immunology at Karolinska Institute in Sweden (1970-1971).

Dr. Neiderhuber is a fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and the American College of Surgeons. He is also a member of the American Association for Cancer Institutes, serving both as Vice-President and President, and a member of the American Association of Immunologists and the American Society of Transplant Surgeons. He has been awarded the Professional Achievement Award from the Ohio State University Alumni Association (2007) and an Honorary Doctor of Science Degree from Bethany College (2007), he was recognized as International Health Professional of the Year at the International Biographical Centre in Cambridge (2003) and is the recipient of the John Collins MD Memorial Award for Outstanding Teaching and Dedication to Resident Training from Stanford University (1996). Dr. Neiderhuber has served on the editorial boards for the *Journal of Immunology*, the *Journal of Surgical Research, Surgery*, and the *Annals of Surgical Oncology*. He has also served on numerous committees and authored over 200 presentations and abstracts, as well as eight books, 93 book chapters and reviews, and over 100 publications and articles.
