

Sherif Ramzy Zaki, M.D., PhD

Dr. Zaki is Chief of Infectious Diseases Pathology Activity in the Division of Viral and Rickettsial Diseases at the National Center for Infectious Diseases, Centers of Disease Control and Prevention in Atlanta, Georgia, a position he has served in since 1997. Dr. Zaki's education includes the following: MBChB from Alexandria Medical School in Alexandria, Egypt (1978); MS from the Department of Pathology, Alexandria University (1982); and PhD in Experimental Pathology from Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia (1989).

Among Dr. Zaki's awards and honors include Secretary Awards for Distinguished Service, the SARS and Monkeypox Public Health Response Team (2004); World Trade Center and Anthrax Investigation Emergency Response Team (2002); Uganda Ebola Outbreak Response Team (2002); Leptospirosis Outbreak Team (1996); and CDC Hantavirus Investigation (1994). Dr. Zaki is affiliated with many professional organizations, including the American Society for Investigative Pathology, American Society of Tropical medicine and Hygiene, Binford-Dammin Society for Infectious Disease Pathology, and the United States and Canadian Academy of Pathology.
