

## **Chief Master Sergeant Troy J. McIntosh**

Chief Master Sergeant Troy J. McIntosh currently serves as the command chief for Air Force Reserve Command at Robins Air Force Base, GA. In this role, he advises the commander on matters influencing the health, morale, welfare and effective utilization of more than 76,000 active duty and reserve enlisted members within the command and serves as the commander's representative to numerous committees, councils, boards and military and civilian functions.

In 1988, Chief McIntosh was assigned to the 7275th Air Base Group at San Vito Air Station, Italy, as the NCOIC of personal affairs. While stationed at San Vito, he deployed to Provide Comfort I, II and III, conducting manpower and personnel duties for the combined task force. As an additional duty, he was appointed NCOIC of the honor guard. In September 1992, Chief McIntosh transitioned from the active component to the Air National Guard, where he worked in personnel readiness for the 144th Fighter Wing at Fresno Air National Guard Base, CA. After eight years, Chief McIntosh moved to the Air Force Reserve, working in the executive support division and policy integration division, where he handled enlisted issues and entitlements. In 2005, he became the superintendent of Active Guard and Reserve (AGR) management, where he was responsible for the personnel management and daily operations of over 2,400 enlisted AGR personnel assigned to the Air Force Reserve and other Department of Defense organizations. He became the Air Force Reserve's 13th command chief in March 2007. His awards include: Joint Service Commendation Medal, Air Force Commendation Medal with three oak leaf clusters, Joint Service Achievement Medal, and Air Force Achievement Medal with two oak leaf clusters.
