



Thomas O'Toole, MD

Thomas O'Toole has dedicated the past two decades to researching and providing health services for the homeless. He founded the primary care clinic for homeless veterans at the Providence VA Medical Center, which strives to improve the health of homeless Veterans, help each Veteran realize his or her potential, and also address the quality of life issues that affect health status. Dr. O'Toole is now the national Director of the Homeless Veteran PACT program, a program that sets up medical homes for homeless Veterans around the country based on the Providence VA model. Before beginning his work at the Providence VA, O'Toole served as associate dean of curriculum at Georgetown University School of Medicine, where he oversaw an educational reform initiative that placed greater emphasis on professionalism and service learning within the school's curriculum.
