

## **Stephen C. Schimpff, MD**

Dr. Schimpff is currently the Director of Mid-Atlantic Bio-Agro Defense Consortium at the University of Maryland in Baltimore and University of Maryland in College Park. He is also the Research Professor of Public Policy at the University of Maryland, College Park and Professor of Oncology and Pharmacology at the University of Maryland, School of Medicine in Baltimore, Maryland. Previously, he has held appointments as the Chief Executive Officer for the University of Maryland Medical Center; the Executive Vice President of the University of Maryland Medical System; the Director of the University of Maryland Cancer Center at the University of Maryland School of Medicine and Medical System; the Head for the Division of Infectious Diseases in the Department of Medicine at the University of Maryland School of Medicine; the Head for the Section of Infection Research, Baltimore Cancer Research Program at the National Cancer Institute; the Senior Investigator for the Baltimore Cancer Research Program at the National Cancer Institute; and the Acting Head of the Medical Service with the Baltimore Cancer Research Program at the National Cancer Institute. Academically, Dr. Schimpff received a B.A. from Rutgers University (1963), where he also received the Van Der Poole Award for Excellence in Medicinal Chemistry, and a MD from Yale Medical School (1967), where he was inducted into the Alpha Omega Alpha honor society.

Dr. Schimpff is a member of several professional societies including: the EORTC's International Antimicrobial Therapy Project Group of which he is a co-founder; the Multinational Association of Supportive Care in Cancer of which he is a founder; the American College of Physicians; the American Society of Clinical Oncology; the Infectious Diseases Society of America; the American Association of Cancer Research; the University Health System Consortium; the Association of American Medical Colleges; the American Society of Clinical Oncology; and the National Board of Medical Examiners. Dr. Schimpff was also the Chair of the Board of Governors of the National Institutes of Health's Warren G. Magnuson Clinical Center, a member of the Board's Executive Committee, and Chair of the Finance Working Group. Dr. Schimpff has published over 200 scientific articles, reviews, and book chapters and has edited three textbooks, including *Comprehensive Textbook of Oncology*. He has also written a book for general audiences entitled *The Future of Medicine: Megatrends in Healthcare That Will Affect Your Quality of Life* and is working on a sequel, which will focus on the impact of healthcare reform on the delivery of healthcare.
