The Surgeon General of the United States Army submitted Dr. Lednar's name to the AFEB for consideration. He is currently the Global Chief Medical Officer and Director, Integrated Health Services for the E.I. du Pont de Nemours and Company. He serves at world headquarters in Wilmington, Delaware.

Dr. Lednar received his MD from George Washington University in Washington, D.C. He completed a Pediatrics Internship at Madigan Army Medical Center and a General Preventive Medicine Residency at Walter Reed Army Institute of Research. He received his PhD in Epidemiology at the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill.

His Honors and Awards include Sigma Xi, National Honor Research Society; Delta Omega, National Honor Society of Public Health; Allie S. Freed, Award of Preventive Medicine; and is the recipient of the George Miller Sternberg Medal in Preventive Medicine.

Dr. Lednar is certified by the American Board of Preventive Medicine in General Preventive Medicine and Public Health, and is a Fellow of the American College of Epidemiology.

Dr. Lednar is currently involved in several academic and professional leadership activities. He is a Member of the Residency Advisory Committee for the General Preventive Medicine Residency Program at Walter Reed Army Institute of Research and the same committee for USUHS; an Adjunct Professor of Community and Preventive Medicine at the School of Medicine, University of Rochester in Rochester, New York; and a member of the Editorial Advisory Board of the *Journal of Health and Productivity*.
