

Gary P. Carlson, PhD

Dr. Carlson is currently a Professor of Toxicology in the School of Health Sciences at Purdue University, a position he has held since 1995. Dr. Carlson is also an Adjunct Professor of Pharmacology and Toxicology at Indiana University School of Medicine. Previously, he has held positions as Associate Head of the School of Health Sciences at Purdue University, Professor of Toxicology in the Department of Pharmacology and Toxicology at Purdue University, and Adjunct Associate Professor of Pharmacology in the Department of Pharmacology and Toxicology at the University of Rhode Island. Academically, Dr. Carlson received a BS in chemistry from St. Bonaventure University (1965) and a Ph.D. in Pharmacology from the University of Chicago (1969).

Dr. Carlson is a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and a member of the American Industrial Hygiene Association, the American Society for Pharmacology and Experimental Therapeutics, the International Society for the Study of Xenobiotics, the Society for Risk Analysis, and the Society of Toxicology. He is listed in American Men and Women of Science, Who's Who Among America's Teachers, Who's Who In American Education, and Who's Who In America Science and Education. He is a Reviewer for several journals including *Alcoholism: Clinical and Experimental Research*; *Chemical Research in Toxicology*, *Environmental Toxicology and Chemistry*, the *Journal of Pharmacy and Pharmacology*, the *Journal of Toxicology*, and *Environmental Health and Toxicology*. Some of Dr. Carlson's numerous awards and achievements include School of Health Sciences Excellence in Teaching Award on two separate occasions and the Society of Toxicology Education Award. Dr. Carlson has had approximately 36 funded grant supports, authored over 200 publications, and served on numerous university and national committees.
