

## **John Herbold, PhD, MPH, DVM**

Dr. Herbold currently serves as the Director of the Center for Biosecurity and Public Health Preparedness at the University of Texas School of Public Health and on the faculty of the UT School of Public Health as an Associate Professor of Epidemiology and of Environmental and Occupational Health Sciences. Dr. Herbold received his BS from Texas A&M University (1968), a DVM from Texas A&M (1969), his MPH from the University of Texas at Chapel Hill (1973), and his PhD from Ohio State University (1981). He served in a variety of veterinary, epidemiological, and preventive medicine capacities during his tenure in the Air Force from 1966 to 1993.

Dr. Herbold is the current President and Executive Board member of the American College of Veterinary Preventive Medicine, a fellow in the American College of Epidemiology, a former President of the Conference of Public Health Veterinarians, and a fellow and former President of the Texas Public Health Association. Dr. Herbold has served as a reviewer for numerous journals and currently serves on the editorial board of *Zoonoses and Public Health* and as a reviewer for the *American Journal of Preventive Medicine* and *Journal of the American Veterinary Medical Association*. Dr. Herbold's honors and recognitions include the Helwig-Jennings Award from the American College of Veterinary Preventive Medicine (2004) and the Secretary of Defense Outstanding Public Service Medal (2003). His military honors include the Legion of Merit (1993), Meritorious Service Medal (1991, 1984, and 1978), Air Force Commendation Medal (1984 and 1972), and the Defense Meritorious Service Medal (1987). Dr. Herbold has authored over 40 publications and has delivered numerous presentations.
