

Robert S. Galvin, MD, MBA

Dr. Galvin is currently Director of Global Health Care at General Electric (GE). The top staff health care position at GE Corporate, it includes responsibility for the design, administration and financial performance of GE's \$3 billion international health benefit expenditures. In addition, Dr. Galvin serves as an Adjunct Professor of Medicine at Yale University School of Medicine, as well as Director of the Health Policy Seminar Series on The Role of the Private Sector, Robert Wood Johnson Clinical Scholar Program and MD-MBA Program, also at Yale University. Academically, Dr. Galvin received his BA from the University of Pennsylvania (1972) as well as his MD (1981). He completed his residency in Internal Medicine at Boston Medical Center University Hospital (1984). Dr. Galvin earned his MBA from Boston University School of Management (1995).

Dr. Galvin is a Fellow of the American College of Physicians and former Chairman of the Massachusetts Business Roundtable Health Care Task Force. He is a current member of the Society of Medical Administrators and was President-Elect in 2007. In addition, he is Co-Founder of the Leapfrog Group, the Massachusetts Health Quality Partnership and the Massachusetts Healthcare Purchaser Group. Dr. Galvin is a Board Member of the National Commission on Quality Assurance (NCQA), the Health Care Solutions Group of Vanderbilt University Medical Center and the Nashville Health Care Council. He served as Chairman of the Board of the Leapfrog Group (2003-2005), Vice-Chair of the Washington Business Group on Health (2001-2004) and as a Committee Member on the National Advisory Board's Agency for Healthcare Research & Quality, the Department of Defense (DoD) Task Force on the Future of Military Health Care, and the Commonwealth Fund Commission on a Highly Effective Healthcare System. Dr. Galvin has published 35 articles, 2 case studies and has given testimony before the Senate and the House of Representatives.
