Dr. Callaway is a board certified Emergency Medicine physician in the Department of Emergency Medicine at Carolinas Medical Center, Charlotte, NC where he also serves as the Associate Medical Director for the Center for Prehospital Medicine. Dr. Callaway is the Co-Founder and Director of the Operational Medicine Institute (OMI) at Harvard Medical Faculty Physicians. He is a former Battalion Surgeon for the 3rd Radio Battalion, U.S. Marine Forces Pacific and Senior Medical Officer for Camp Commando in the Kingdom of Kuwait during Operation Iraqi Freedom. Dr. Callaway earned his BA from Carleton College (1996) and his MD from Georgetown University School of Medicine (2001). He completed his internship in Surgery at the Naval Medical Center in San Diego (2001-2002) and his residency in Emergency Medicine at the Harvard Affiliated Emergency Medicine Residency Program at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center, Boston, MA.

Dr. Callaway is a member of the Society for Academic Emergency Medicine and American College of Emergency Physicians.
