Dr. Gandy is currently an Emergency Medicine Physician with Shenandoah Emergency Physicians in Woodstock, VA. He recently retired from the USAF with his final duty station being Chief of Aerospace Medicine, Detachment 3, Air Force Flight Test Center, Las Vegas, NV. He has previously held positions as Commander of Aerospace Medicine Flight with the 24th Special Tactics Squadron; Group Surgeon with the 720th Special Tactics Group; Emergency Physician at Eglin Regional Hospital; and Chief Resident of Emergency Medicine at Wilford Hall Medical Center. He has participated in numerous worldwide deployments supporting Special Operations Forces.
