

Warner D. Farr, MD, BSMT, MPH, MSS

COL Farr is currently the Command Surgeon for the Special Operations Command Central within the U.S. Central Command. Previously, he was the Command Surgeon for the US Special Operations Command in Tampa, FL. His previous positions include Commander of Company F (ABN), 3rd BN, Academy BDE at the Academy of Health Sciences; Course Director of the Special Operations Medical Sergeants Course; Chief of Army Aviator Evaluation at the USAF School of Aerospace Medicine at Brooks Air Force Base; Chief of the Department of Pathology at Blanchfield Army Community Hospital; Flight Surgeon, 50th Medical Company (Air Ambulance), 101st ABN Division (Air Assault) at Fort Campbell; Command Surgeon at US Army Special Forces Command; and Command Surgeon at the US Army Civil Affairs and Psychological Operations Command. He received his M.D. in 1983 from U.S.U.H.S. and has completed residencies and board certifications in aerospace medicine and anatomic/clinical pathology. He completed his Master of Public Health degree at the University of Texas and a Masters of Strategic Studies at the Air University.

COL Farr has numerous operational tours including Bosnia, Kosovo, Vietnam, Cambodia, Iraq, and Afghanistan. He is the last active service member who served in MACV-SOG, a unique and highly decorated Special Operations unit in Vietnam.
