

## **LTC Robert L. Mabry, MD**

LTC Mabry is currently the military Emergency Medical Services Program Director at the San Antonio Military Medical Center. His previous assignments include Director of the Prehospital Division of the Joint Theater Trauma System, Academic Director of the Department of Combat Medic Training in Fort Sam Houston Texas and Battalion Surgeon and Battalion Executive Officer in the First Special Forces Group. Prior to medical school, he served for over a decade as a Special Forces 18-D medic, where he was a participant in the Battle of Mogadishu. He is also an Airborne Ranger Infantryman (1984-1987).

Academically, LTC Mabry received a BS from Campbell University in 1995 and an MD from the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences in 1999. He completed an Emergency Medicine Residency at Brooke Army Medical Center at Fort Sam in Houston, Texas from 1999-2003. He was Emergency Medicine Chief Resident from 2002-2003, supervising 42 emergency medicine residents and interns. LTC Mabry also completed an Emergency Medical Services fellowship at Brooke Army Medical Center.

LTC Mabry's awards include the Silver Star, Bronze Star, Purple Heart, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (two awards), and the Combat Field Medical Badge (2 awards). He has authored many publications and presented at meetings and courses both nationally and internationally on the subjects of urban warfare, battlefield medicine, and training of combat medics. He is the recipient of the Michael J. Olinger Outstanding Emergency Medicine Clinician Award, the Gillespie Award for Outstanding Transitional Intern, the Outstanding Medical Student Award from the Association of Military Surgeons of the U.S., and the Outstanding Medical Student Award from the American College of Emergency Physicians, Government Services Chapter.
