

COL Kevin C. O'Connor, D.O.

COL O'Connor is currently the Vice-President's Physician at the White House in Washington, DC. He has worked in the White House Medical Office since November 2006. Previous positions include Officer-in-Charge of the Warrior Family Medicine Clinic Development Project in Fort Carson; Joint Strike Force Surgeon/Battalion Surgeon with the 3rd Battalion, 75th Ranger Regiment in support of Operation Enduring Freedom in Afghanistan; Chief of the Department of Family Practice at Evans Army Community Hospital; and Command Surgeon of the 1st Special Forces Operational Detachment.

Academically, COL O'Connor received a BS from Saint Bonaventure University (1988), majoring in Biology and minoring in Theology. He received a D.O. from the New York College of Osteopathic Medicine in 1992. COL O'Connor completed an internship in Family Practice (1992-1993), a residency in Family Practice (1992-1995), and was Chief Resident at the Mountainside Hospital Department of Family Practice (1994-1995).

COL O'Connor is a graduate of the U.S. Army Command and General Staff Officer's Course (2003) and the U.S. Army Advanced Operational Warfighting Course (2004). He is a Diplomate with the American Board of Family Practice and the National Board of Osteopathic Medical Examiners and is certified as a United States Army Flight Surgeon (1998) and a Hyperbaric Medical Officer (2002). COL O'Connor has received numerous military decorations, including the Bronze Star Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Joint Services Commendation Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Joint Services Achievement Medal, and National Defense Service Medal.
