Mr. Parsons is currently a Physician Assistant in the Department of Combat Medic Training at Fort Sam Houston in San Antonio, TX and Deputy Course Director for the Army 68W medic training. In this role, he has primary oversight for the training of all new Army medics. Prior to his present role, he has held positions as a Physician Assistant at Brooke Army Medical Center at Fort Sam Houston in San Antonio, TX; Chief/Program Director of the Intraservice Physician Assistant Program at Fort Sam Houston in San Antonio, TX and Physician Assistant at Madigan Army Medical Center in Tacoma, Washington.

Academically, Mr. Parsons received an Associates of Science in the field of Allied Health from Baylor University (1977), a BS in Physician Assistant Studies from Wayland Baptist University (1991), and a Master of Science in Physician Assistant Studies from the University of Nebraska (1999).
