

Master Chief Petty Officer Glenn T. Royes

Master Chief Petty Officer Royes was selected as the US Coast Guard's Health Services Technician Rating Force Master Chief in June 2011. Master Chief Royes transferred to his new position from the Deployable Operations Group where he served as the Senior Enlisted Advisor on Tactical Medicine. He also serves as a member of the Committee on Tactical Combat Casualty Care falling under the Defense Health Board.

Master Chief Royes is a native of Governors Island, NY. He graduated from Curtis High School in 1992. He completed Basic Military Training at US Coast Guard Training Center Cape May, NJ in April 1993 followed by his first permanent duty station, USCGC VIGOROUS (WMEC 625). Onboard the VIGOROUS he assumed many duties some of which included Assistant Damage Control Petty Officer, .50 cal gunner, and boarding team member. Following a successful tour with the VIGOROUS, he served a short tour at Reserve Training Center Yorktown. After this assignment he attended Health Services Technician "A" School, graduating in June 1996. His first assignment as a Corpsman was at U.S. Coast Guard Air Station Clearwater where he served in the outpatient care, X-Ray, and Physical Exams departments. In addition to his normal clinical duties he volunteered to stand flight medevac duty. Following this assignment he reported to USCGC VENTUROUS (WMEC 625) where he served as the Independent Duty Corpsman. A few of his many duties onboard included Ion Scan Operator, Damage Control Training Team member, and Inport Officer of the Deck. In 2001 he was named Sailor of the Quarter and subsequently was named the 2001 Health Services Technician of the Year (Afloat). His next tour was at TRACEN Petaluma where he filled the roles of HS "A" School instructor, Assistant Course Chief, IDHS "C" School and Course Chief IDHS "C" School. While serving at TRACEN Petaluma, he volunteered with several organizations supporting the local community. A few of these are Coastal Cleanup, Crusin' the Boulevard, Boys and Girls Club, and Rebuilding Together where he served as Vice President on the Board of Directors.

Master Chief Royes has attended numerous schools throughout his career to include USCG Chief Petty Officers Academy, Instructor Development Course, Accomplished Based Curriculum Development Course, Introduction to Environmental Health, Unit Safety Coordinator Course, U.S. Air Force Independent Duty Medical Technician School, U.S. Navy Basic X-Ray Technician School, Emergency Medical Technician, and the Operational Emergency Medicine Skills Course.

Master Chief Royes' military awards include one Coast Guard Meritorious Service Medal, two Coast Guard Commendation Medals with Operational device, five Commandants Letter of Commendations with Operational device, one Presidential Unit Citation with hurricane symbol, one DOT Outstanding Unit Award, two Coast Guard Unit Commendations with Operational device, one Coast Guard Meritorious Unit Commendations with Operational device, seven Coast Guard Meritorious Team Commendations with Operational device, four Coast Guard "E" ribbons, six Coast Guard Good Conduct Medals, two National Defense Service Medals, one Military Outstanding Volunteer Medal, one Global War Terror Services Medal, one Humanitarian Service Medal, two Coast Guard Sea Service Ribbons, one Coast Guard Rifle Ribbon and one Coast Guard Pistol Ribbon. He is authorized to permanently wear the U. S. Coast Guard Cutterman's Insignia.
