

Norman E. McSwain, Jr., MD, FACS

Dr. McSwain is currently Vice Chairman in the Department of Surgery at Tulane University. He is also Residency Program Director and Professor in the Department of Surgery at Tulane University and a Clinical Professor at the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences (USUHS). Previously Dr. McSwain held appointments as Instructor in Surgery at Emory University Affiliated Hospitals; Assistant and Associate Professor of Surgery at the University of Kansas; and Associate Residency Program Director at Tulane University. Academically, Dr. McSwain holds a BS from The University of The South (1959) and a MD from the University of Alabama (1963). He completed his Internship in Surgery at Bowman-Gray School of Medicine (1965) and his Residency in Surgery at Emory University School of Medicine (1970).

Dr. McSwain is a retired US Navy Captain. He is a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons and a member of the American Association for the Surgery of Trauma; the American College of Emergency Physicians; the American Surgical Association; and the Association for Academic Surgery. He sits on the Editorial Board for *Comprehensive Therapy*; *Emergency Medicine*; *Emergency Care Quarterly*; *Prehospital and Disaster Medicine*; and *Trauma Chronicle*; and serves as an Editor or Editorial Consultant for 6 separate publications. Dr. McSwain has earned the Air Force Commendation Medal on two separate occasions; the Award of Excellence from the Kansas Emergency Medical Training Association (1977); the President's Leadership Award from the National Association of Emergency Medical Technicians (1980); a Citation for Outstanding Performance as a General Surgeon during Operation Desert Storm from the US Naval Forces Central Command (1991); the Distinguished Achievement Award from the American Trauma Society (1993); the Virginia S. Furrow Award from Tulane University School of Medicine (1998); the National Public Health Hero Award from the University of California-Berkeley's School of Public Health (2006); and the Distinguished Lectureship Award from the Society of Trauma Nurses (2008), among numerous other awards and achievements. Dr. McSwain has authored or co-authored over 500 publications and delivered approximately 786 professional presentations.
