Dr. Albright is currently Director of Collaborative Initiatives at Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT). She is also a Visiting Scientist at MIT and a Lecturer in the Harvard Medical School Surgery program. After attending Radcliffe College, Dr. Albright received her MD from Harvard Medical School. She has also received 8 honorary degrees.

Dr. Albright has served on the Board of Directors of the Whitehead Institute for Biomedical Research and on the Board of West Pharmaceutical Services. She sits on the Board of Research!America and is also on the Leadership Committee at the McGovern Institute for Brain Research as well as the Steering Committee for Biomedical Innovation at MIT. Dr. Albright has also been Chair of the National Institutes of Health National Library of Medicine's (NLM) Board of Regents and co-chaired the NLM's Health Information Infrastructure Symposia. Previously, Dr. Albright was appointed by the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services and the President as a delegate to the World Health Assembly for four years. She has also been involved in international polio eradication efforts. Dr. Albright has received the Research!America Advocacy Award for her work to advance medical and health research.
