

**Biographical Summary**  
**of**  
**Brigadier General C. William Fox, Jr. M.D.**  
**United States Army retired**

BG (ret) C. William Fox, Jr. is a native of Novato, California. He received a Bachelor of Science Degree in Biology from the University of San Francisco in 1977, where he attended on an Army ROTC scholarship and was a Distinguished Military Graduate and recipient of the Stilwell Sabre.

BG Fox attended the second class of the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences (USUHS) Medical School in 1977, where he graduated with a doctorate of medicine and Alpha Omega Alpha selection in 1981.

He is a board certified Urologic Surgeon and has served in a variety of Army command, staff, and surgical positions including: 5th Special Forces Group Surgeon, Fort Bragg, North Carolina; Company Commander, Company F. (Airborne), Fort Sam Houston, Texas; Executive Officer, 274th Forward Surgical Team (Airborne), Fort Bragg, North Carolina; Chief of Urology at Womack Army Medical Center, Fort Bragg, North Carolina; Commander, 212th Mobile Army Surgical Hospital, Wiesbaden, Germany; Army Special Operations Command Surgeon, Fort Bragg, North Carolina; Commander, U.S. Army Hospital and Joint Readiness Training Center Surgeon, Fort Polk, Louisiana; and the 30th Medical Brigade Commander and V Corps Surgeon in Heidelberg, Germany. During his command, the 30th Medical Brigade provided medical care to NATO forces in Kosovo and Macedonia as part of Operation Joint Guardian. Since April 2001, BG Fox has served as Commander, 44th Medical Command, XVIII Airborne Corps Surgeon and the Director of Health Services at Fort Bragg. Under his command, the 44th Medical Command supported medical operations in Operation Noble Eagle throughout the United States, Operation Enduring Freedom in Uzbekistan and Afghanistan, and Operation Iraqi Freedom in Kuwait and Iraq. BG Fox deployed to Afghanistan in Feb 2003 and served as the Director of the combined and joint forces totaling 16,000 forces comprised of US and 22 coalition nations. Under his direction the design and implementation of provincial reconstruction teams was initiated that combined coalition forces, state department, NGOs and PVOs, and the interim government into teams that worked the assigned province to identify and seek approval for reconstruction efforts from the interim government. BG Fox was then assigned to be the Commanding General for the Great Plains Regional Medical Command and Brooke Army Medical Center in San Antonio, Texas. During this period the 10 regional Army hospitals provided medical care to more Army forces mobilizing and

deploying/redeploying than any other region. Brooke Army medical Center established the second DoD Amputee Care Center, initiated a 47 million dollar state of the art limb salvation and amputee care center with the Intrepid Foundation, received DoD recognition for innovations in healthcare, and established significant improvements in healthcare administration with the Air Force and VA in San Antonio that saved millions of dollars. BG Fox elected to retire at the end of his command and join Doctors Community Healthcare Corporation as the Executive Vice President for healthcare strategy and government relations. He has just recently accepted the position of Chief Operating Officer and Executive Vice President for Project Hope located in Millwood, Virginia.

BG Fox is a veteran of Operations Desert Shield/Desert Storm, Operation Joint Guardian, and Operation Enduring Freedom. He was recognized as the Army LTC Physician of the Year for 1994 and received the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff distinguished essay award for Senior Service Colleges in 1997. He is a graduate of the Command and General Staff College and the U.S. Army War College. BG Fox is the first graduate of the USUHS to achieve the rank of general officer in the Army since the university's inception in 1976.

BG Fox's military schools include the Army Medical Department Officer Basic and Advanced Courses, Command and General Staff College, US Army War College, Airborne and Air Assault Schools, Flight Surgeon School, and the Special Forces Qualification Course.

Among BG Fox's military awards and decorations are the Distinguished Service Medal, Legion of Merit (four Oak Leaf Clusters), Bronze Star Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (four Oak Leaf Clusters), Army Commendation Medal (one Oak Leaf Cluster), Southwest Asia Service Medal, Combat Medical Badge, Special Forces Tab, Expert Field Medical Badge, Air Assault Badge, Airborne Badge and Army Flight Surgeon Badge, Meritorious Unit Citation, and Superior Unit Award. He has airborne wings from the U.S. Marine Corps and seven foreign countries.

BG Fox is married to the former Janet Sue McCoury, of Tacoma, Washington. He has two daughters, Leslie, 28 and Melissa, 24.
