FACT SHEET SNPMIS

SPECIAL NEEDS PROGRAM MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEM



SNPMIS is a client-server application that documents and manages data regarding early intervention services provided to eligible infants, toddlers, and school-aged children enrolled in the Department of Defense Education Activity schools. It plays a critical role in readiness decisions for service member relocations and deployment actions that may affect the health of family members with special needs.

There are approximately 43 Educational and Developmental Interventions Services sites worldwide operated by the U.S. Army, Navy and Air Force. These sites use SNPMIS to help active-duty military families with children who have special needs. It allows qualified staff members to document and manage early intervention services data as mandated by the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act. The system also lets patients and medical care teams review and discuss treatments and services and facilitates greater collaboration between health care, educational, and social service providers.

- Collects and stores eligibility, referral, evaluation, and service plan data for beneficiaries
- Identifies location-specific early intervention services
- Manages special education services for school-aged children
