c. Describe the purpose of this DoD information system or electronic collection and describe the types of personal information about individuals collected in the system.

The Knowledge Exchange (Kx) is a solution sponsored by the Defense Health Agency (DHA) that uses the Microsoft SharePoint platform with user-specified customizations to provide a robust enterprise content management and professional collaboration tool for all branches of the military and their contractors. This solution allows users to create and maintain intranet sites to host artifacts, materials, guidance, tools, and discussions, and includes a virtual library which provides an access point to medical journals/books and applications. This solution is both .mil and .com-accessible using Common Access Card (CAC) or Personal Identify Verification (PIV) card authentication and access is restricted only to content to which users are entitled.

Kx operates within the Amazon Web Services (AWS) General Support System (GSS) environment which resides in AWS GovCloud, an isolated AWS region, to support the strict regulatory and compliance requirements of United States (US) government agencies. The Managed Services Office (MSO) provides management and administrative support to systems within this environment, to include regulation of users, networks, hosts and other resources. Operational policies and constraints for a systems operating in this environment are available in the AWS GSS documentation. As part of its collaboration and content management offerings, the Kx SharePoint platform provides users the opportunity to collect and/or store Personally Identifiable Information (PII); however, the primary responsibility for determining what PII elements are to be collected and stored lies with the primary Department of Defense (DoD) component, Military Treatment Facility (MTF), or Federal Agency where PII is initially collected and primarily maintained.

The following categories of individuals from which PII is collected includes Active Duty Service Members, National Guard personnel, Reserve personnel, members of the general public, and Federal employees. Kx does not serve as the initial point of collection for any PII elements introduced by users.

Kx is owned and managed by the Web and Mobile Technology Program Management Office (W&MT PMO)/Solution Delivery Division (SDD)/Program Executive Office (PEO) Medical Systems (J-6)/Defense Health Agency (DHA).

PII is collected for mission-related and administrative purposes.
