

Special Needs Program Management Information System (SNPMIS) FACT SHEET

SNPMIS is an enterprise-wide application that documents and manages data regarding early intervention services provided to eligible infants, toddlers, and school-aged children enrolled in the Department of Defense Education Activity schools. It plays a critical role in readiness decisions for service member relocations and deployment actions that may affect the health of family members with special needs.

There are approximately 43 Educational and Developmental Interventions Services sites worldwide operated by the U.S. Army, Navy and Air Force. These sites use SNPMIS to help active-duty military families with children who have special needs. It enables qualified staff members to document and manage early intervention services data as mandated by the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). The system allows patients and medical care teams to review and discuss treatments and services while also enhancing collaboration among health care, educational, and social service providers.

- Supports clinical data management and managed health processes
- Tracks services provided to children with special needs as directed by the IDEA
- Manages special education services for school-aged children
- Enhances mission readiness, supports family stability, and fosters a resilient military community
