c. Describe the purpose of this DoD information system or electronic collection and describe the types of personal information about individuals collected in the system.

Nuance PowerScribe 360 v4 Voice Dictation System (PS360V4) is a voice recognition system that is used in radiology departments to facilitate dictation and reporting of radiology studies. This system is extensible and has the potential to integrate with existing, or future, multi-site workflow management, and electronic medical records management systems. It will connect to existing radiology imaging systems, e.g., Picture Archiving and Communication Systems (PACS) or Radiology Information System (RIS). This is a major application that has a network connection and its users consist of Role-Based Access (RBAC): Radiologists - standard user account without elevated privileges. Role-Based Access (RBAC): Administrator - local administrator user account with elevated privileges. PII/PHI data is in transit and at rest within PS360V4.

Minimal patient information is collected from an existing DoD Hospital Information System (HIS) and/or Radiology Information System (RIS) server. PowerScribe 360 device is not the source system of the information. The PII elements collected is specific to the information system and are addressed in the respective system's PIA. Types of PII: Race/Ethnicity, Birth Date, DoD ID, Gender, Medical Information, Name(s).

The intended use and reason the PII is collected is for data matching of the individual with his/her medical diagnostic reports and to ensure accuracy when these reports are integrated in the medical records for that individual. The intended use of the PII is provide continuity of patient care.
