c. Describe the purpose of this DoD information system or electronic collection and describe the types of personal information about individuals collected in the system.

The Department of Defense (DoD) Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) Overseas Program was introduced by the DoD Health Affairs (HA) to provide eligible members of the Armed Forces, civilian employees, and DoD contractors living overseas, and their family members with nutritional foods. The WIC Overseas Participant Information Management System (WIC PIMS) Information System (IS) collects and processes program data containing limited Personally Identifiable Information (PII) and Protected Health Information (PHI) necessary to administer benefits and manage the program.

Personally Identifiable Information (PII)/Protected Health Information (PHI) collected by the WIC PIMS IS includes demographic information, contact information, medical information, truncated Social Security Number (SSN), and family information. Collection of truncated SSN (last four) will end by 12/31/2025 and existing data will be purged from the WIC PIMS IS by 7/31/2026.

The WIC PIMS Information System (IS) resides on one Platform-as-a-Service (PaaS) Windows Server 2019 virtual machine (VM) and one Database-as-a-Service (DBaaS) Microsoft SQL Server 2019 instance, both hosted by the Medical Community of Interest (MedCOI) Wilford Hall data center. The Windows Server 2019 VM has Internet Information System (IIS) installed to host a website. The Microsoft SQL Server 2019 DBaaS instance contains one Microsoft SQL database used to aggregate data from the PIMS desktop applications in use at the various WIC Overseas sites located on military installations overseas in Europe and the Far East to provide draft reconciliation, reporting, and other management functions. The data center environment is supported by additional entities that together comprise the hosting platform: Network Services Operation Center (NSOC), MedCOI, Compute and Storage Management Service (CSMS), DHA Medical Joint Active Directory (mJAD), and DHA Enterprise Splunk. Access to the WIC PIMS IS is restricted to users in the .mil domain and further restricted to WIC Overseas contractors with a valid DoD-issued CAC or ALT.

The system is owned by the DHA, TRICARE Health Plan Division, and operated by WIC Overseas, Cherokee Nation Aerospace and Defense. Information regarding the WIC Overseas Program can be obtained from <https://www.tricare.mil/wic>.
