2. NEW BUSINESS

February 11, 2015—Administrative Session

Dr. Nancy Dickey welcomed Defense Health Board (DHB) members and Subcommittee members to the meeting. Ms. Bader noted the upcoming retirement of Mr. Allen Middleton, reviewed the status of DHB Subcommittee and Board member nominee packages, and introduced new contract support staff. She then discussed the status of recent DHB recommendations. The group reviewed plans for the May, August, and November 2015 Board meetings. Ms. Bader also reminded members to report any conflicts of interest they may have regarding the meeting.

Action/POC: None.

February 11, 2015—Open Session

a. Administrative & Opening Remarks

Dr. Nancy Dickey opened the meeting and welcomed the attendees. Ms. Bader called the meeting to order as the DHB Alternate Designated Federal Officer. Following a moment of silence to honor Service members, meeting attendees introduced themselves.

Action/POC: None.

b. Decision Brief: Sustainment and Advancement of Amputee Care

Dr. George Anderson, Chair of the Health Care Delivery Subcommittee, provided an overview of the report's lessons and recommendations. Prompted by the Subcommittee's recommendation for a prospective amputee cohort study, participants stated that the Department of Defense (DoD) may have an opportunity to consolidate data gathering efforts by leveraging existing cohorts or assembling cohorts which may be used to conduct multiple prospective cohort studies; Dr. Dickey indicated this could be a topic for further examination by the DHB. Board members and meeting participants held a robust discussion about the recommendation that DoD should find every opportunity to increase caseload at each of the Amputee Rehabilitation Centers (ARCs) before considering consolidation into a single center of excellence. The group also noted that

there are many concurrent efforts to advance amputee care ongoing at the Department of Veterans Affairs. The Board then agreed upon changes to the following findings and recommendations:

- **Recommendation 3.3:** Members added "caregivers and support systems" to the recommendation.
- **Recommendation 9:** The Board concurred to insert "accredited programs" and "post-graduate training experiences in ARC settings in order to build and maintain provider expertise."
- **Finding 10:** Members discussed the lack of available data for the ARCs and the value of amputee care at length. The Board agreed to add the sentence "One cannot determine value without accurate data on cost" to the finding.

The Board voted unanimously to approve the report with the agreed upon revisions. The report will be finalized for signature following the meeting.

Action/POC: Finalize the Sustainment and Advancement of Amputee Care report with noted changes/DHB staff.

c. Defense Health Agency: One Year Update

Lt Gen Douglas Robb, Director of the Defense Health Agency (DHA), provided an overview of the Combat Support Agency's stand-up and accomplishments since being established on October 1, 2013. He stated that all ten shared services of the DHA had reached initial operating capability as of October 1, 2014, and the agency had achieved net savings of approximately \$236 million in Fiscal Year 2014. Second-year focus areas of the DHA were also shared, including the Military Health System (MHS) Performance Management System.

Action/POC: None.

d. Decision Brief: Ethical Guidelines and Practices for U.S. Military Medical Professionals

Dr. Adil Shamoo, Chair of the Medical Ethics Subcommittee, as well as members of the Medical Ethics Subcommittee, presented the report's findings and recommendations. Public comments were received by various stakeholders, to include members of professional health care organizations, Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences (USUHS), and Service liaisons. During public comment, it was noted that there was a recent British study on effectiveness of ethical decision making. One public commentator highlighted what he perceived to be a continued inconsistency of DoD policy with professional health care organizations' codes of ethics regarding participation in interrogation and force-feeding. It was also requested that language in the report be amended regarding the American Psychological Association's position on psychologist involvement in torture.

The Board noted inconsistent terminology in the findings and recommendations related to "health care professionals" and agreed to use this term throughout the report, replacing "health care providers" and "health care personnel." The Board voted unanimously to approve the report with the agreed upon revisions. The report will be finalized for signature following the meeting.

Action/POC: Finalize the Ethical Guidelines and Practices for U.S. Military Medical Professionals report with noted changes/DHB staff.

e. Global Health Engagement

Dr. David Smith, Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense for Health Affairs, Force Health Protection and Readiness, provided a briefing on DoD global health engagement. Dr. Smith noted global health engagement is an instrument that supports DoD and U.S. Government efforts worldwide by enhancing host nation stability, cooperation, and capacity. He highlighted DoD's global health engagement efforts, such as the Ebola response, and reviewed DoD's global health activities supporting the global health security agenda.

Action/POC: None.

f. Neurological/Behavioral Health Subcommittee Update

Dr. David Hovda, Chair of the Neurological/Behavioral Health Subcommittee, provided an update on the Subcommittee's tasking on the scientific evidence of using population normative values for comparison in post-concussive computerized neurocognitive assessments. He noted the Subcommittee's recent meeting with subject matter experts and areas of interest, including advances in neurocognitive assessment tools; the effectiveness of the automated neuropsychological assessment metrics (ANAM) in post-injury evaluations; impact of the ANAM on decision-making; the current normative ANAM dataset; the costs and benefits associated with ANAM use; and alternatives to the ANAM. It was suggested during the update that the Subcommittee consult with Dr. Wayne Chappelle of the U.S. Air Force School of Medicine, who has been researching and performing baseline neurocognitive testing on pilots.

Action/POC: None.

g. Continuing Health Education Update

Dr. Nancy Dickey, President of the Board, provided an update on the subset's tasking. She reviewed the meetings to date and areas of interest of the report. These areas include establishment of a central DoD Continuing Health Education (CHE) office; maintenance of competency; the value of face-to-face professional meetings; the correlation of CHE metrics with safety and quality metrics; and the opportunity for DoD to lead in CHE innovation. Board members suggested the subset may wish to look at work on CHE innovation being conducted by various organizations including the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Stanford University, Coursera, or Khan Academy, as well as the Josiah Macy, Jr. Foundation on team training. The subset of members tentatively plans to present its report at the May meeting.

Action/POC: None.

February 12, 2015--Administrative Session

DHB members toured facilities at the Val G. Hemming Simulation Center at USUHS, including a demonstration of a three-dimensional immersive environment named "the WAVE" (Wide Area Virtual Environment). Members also toured the National Museum of Health and Medicine.
