



Operational Support





- **Expeditionary Medical unit (10 Bed) Q-West Iraq**
- First to Deploy Tier 1 Platforms USS Wasp (LHD-1) and two EMFs
- **USNS COMFORT (T-AH-20)**
 - NMCP maintains Critical Core billets
 - Currently deployed, NMCP provided the majority of personnel in support of Humanitarian Assistance/Disaster Relief in Puerto Rico (backfilled NMCP with a fraction of reserve personnel)
 - Supported "Continuing Promise" (CP-15) Apr-Sep 2015, deployed 475 military personnel to 11 countries treating 124,047 patients; provided 345,270 healthcare services.
- **Clinical Support Services**
 - Radiology "Nighthawk" services
 - Telemedicine services (Health Experts OnLine at Portsmouth (HELP)
- **Medically Ready Force**
 - Support approximately 450 commands.



Master Plan

Master Plan completed 31 March 2017 Highlights:

- Repair and modernization of Surgical Services to include 20 operating rooms (ORs), Pre-Op, PACU, and perioperative support. (FY19 Swing, \$72.4M)
 - Feasibility study currently underway with March completion.
 - Fetal Assessment (FY19, \$800K) and PICU Relocations (Un-programmed, \$1.5M)
 - » Required prior to start of OR construction
- Lab Modernization (FY19, \$30.1M)

Un-programmed:

- SPD Repairs Design underway, August FY18 completion (\$8.9M)
- Central Procedures Unit Building 2, 3rd floor (\$10.4M)
- A 145,000 square foot addition, Building 3 (\$87M)
 - Consolidates Outpatient Women's and Children's Health
 - Consolidates Outpatient Mental Health Services.
- Modernize inpatient units converting multi-bed wards to private rooms wherever possible (\$37.8M)
- The renovation of Building 3 to allow for the consolidation and co-location of various outpatient services (\$6M)
- Modernize clinics, Building 2, Provides for Medical Home Port clinics (\$28.5M)
