

Chief Master Sergeant Tanya Y. Johnson is the Senior Enlisted Leader (SEL) for the Director of Staff (DoS) at the Defense Health Agency (DHA). As the DoS SEL, Chief is responsible for providing enlisted oversight and support to execution of the DHA's Combat Support Activities with a staff of 479 military and civilian employees to include Administration and Management (J-1); Operations, Plans, and Requirements Division (J-3); Logistics Planning (J-4); Strategic Planning and Integrations (J-5); Information Operations (J-6); Education and Training (J-7); Financial Operations (J-8) in support of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and Combatant Commanders. Additionally, she advises the DoS on decisions affecting support to operating forces engaged in planning or conducting military operations, including support during conflict, humanitarian/contingency events or in the conduct of

other military activities related to countering threats to U.S. National Security. Furthermore, as the Air Force Element Superintendent, she provides direction pertaining to the proper training, utilization, and development of 189 Airmen.

Chief Johnson entered the Air Force as an Airman Basic in October 1993. She graduated Medical Laboratory Apprentice Technical Training Course in December 1994.
