Dear Mr Chairman

This letter is in response to a request by the Senate Report 109-292 for the Assistant Secretary of Defense (Health Affairs) to provide a report on the impact of the nursing shortage on the military health care delivery system by March 1, 2007. This report is to outline options to alleviate the shortage of nurses and cultivate nurses for the military workforce. The report will address recruitment and retention issues, evaluate the medical enlisted commissioning programs, and explore the "Troops-to-Nurse Teachers" program based upon the Department of Defense's Troops-to-Teachers program, which will look at potential assignment of military nurse educators for duty at accredited baccalaureate schools of nursing to capitalize on the expertise and skills of military nurse veterans.

Due to the detailed requirements of this request, additional time is required to adequately address and provide a comprehensive report on this issue. The Department anticipates a final report will be sent to Congress in May 2007.
