
Dear Mr. Chairman:

This letter responds to the language in House Report 112-78, page 156, to accompany H.R. 1540, the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2012, which requests the Secretary of Defense to review the current processes and procedures of the various Military Health Systems (MHSs) to ensure that fair and open competition for medical research, consultation, and education is being conducted. This issue falls under my purview and I have been asked to respond.

In order to complete this report, the Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense for Force Health Protection and Readiness issued a memorandum dated June 22, 2011, to the Deputy Surgeons General of the Army, Navy, and Air Force; the President of the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences; and the Deputy Director of TRICARE Management Activity, requesting they review their current processes and procedures to ensure that fair and open competition for medical research, consultation, and education is being conducted, and that they provide a summary of their findings. A summary of findings from each addressee is provided at tabs 2-6 of the enclosure. The findings confirm that fair and open competition for medical research is being conducted by the various MHSs included herein. A similar letter has been sent to the Chairmen of the other congressional defense committees.




