30 JUL 2015 (next report 6 AUG 2015)



CASE REPORT: According to [WHO on 29 JUL](#), there was a net increase of 6 (7 new, 1 reclassified as a non-case) confirmed and 37 suspected and/or probable Ebola virus disease (EVD) cases (+10 total deaths) in Guinea, and Sierra Leone between 20 and 26 JUL. The total count of 27,784 cases (11,294 deaths) includes past cases and deaths from Liberia, Italy, Senegal, Nigeria, the United States, Spain, Mali, and the United Kingdom. On 20 JUL, WHO declared Italy Ebola transmission free.

Guinea reported four new confirmed cases from Conakry (3) and Coyah (1), a decrease from 22 new cases the previous week. Sierra Leone reported three confirmed cases in Western Area Urban (Freetown) (2) and Tonkolili (1), a decrease from four the previous week, and one case from Port Loko was reclassified as a non-case. The Tonkolili case traveled from Freetown and was diagnosed after death. With more than 500 contacts identified, WHO is concerned that the case poses a substantial risk for further transmission. The other six cases this week were all registered contacts of known cases.

Liberia has reported no additional cases associated with the recent re-emergence of EVD since 12 JUL.

On 2 JUL, WHO's sixth [Emergency Committee meeting](#) on the 2014 EVD outbreak agreed that the outbreak continues to constitute a Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC) and that all previous recommendations remain in effect with some additions and emphasized the goal of zero transmission.

DoD RESPONSE: On 18 MAY, CJCS specifically said Liberia is no longer an area of widespread EVD transmission and controlled monitoring will no longer be required for personnel returning from Liberia. As of 11 JUN, the 48th Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Brigade [completed their mission](#) as the joint forces' headquarters element providing oversight duties in Liberia. DoD personnel continue to provide support to the Liberian Institute of Biomedical Research. Other support efforts have transitioned to USAID, NIH and CDC.

DIAGNOSTICS AND MEDICAL COUNTERMEASURES: Visit the WHO's [Ebola vaccines, therapies, and diagnostics](#) page for information about clinical trials and evaluations of potential vaccines, therapies, and diagnostics for Ebola virus disease. Tekmira [suspended production](#) of its drug cocktail, TKM-Ebola, which was developed with DoD; phase 2 trials suggested little efficacy in humans. [Emergent BioSolutions](#) received a two-year, \$19.7 million task order from HHS on 20 JUL to continue developing its experimental monoclonal antibody therapy for Ebola.

USG AND GLOBAL RESPONSE: An [independent panel](#) reviewing the WHO's Ebola response said the health agency is incapable of adequately responding to a public health emergency and made several recommendations for change. Current information and guidance is available at the [CDC](#) and [WHO](#) Ebola web sites. [CDC published](#) a summary of the current published science about human-to-human transmission of Ebola virus on 23 JUL.

TRAVEL ADVISORY: The CDC is maintaining its [Warning - Level 3, Avoid Nonessential Travel](#) advisory for Guinea and Sierra Leone and [Warning - Level 2, Practice Enhanced Precautions](#) for Liberia despite the newly reported cases. [All flights carrying travelers from these three West African nations](#) must continue to enter the U.S. through one of five designated airports that are conducting enhanced screening for EVD (JFK, Newark Liberty, Washington Dulles, Chicago O'Hare, and Atlanta Hartsfield-Jackson). The CDC has [relaxed screening procedures](#) for passengers traveling from Liberia to the United States; for these travelers, airport temperature checks and the requirement for active monitoring were immediately discontinued. Personal health check kits (CARE kits) are still being distributed to these travelers. CDC continues to recommend that state public health departments [implement active post-arrival monitoring for 21 days](#) along with other movement restrictions based on a traveler's exposure risk category using CDC definitions; this restriction currently applies only to travelers from Sierra Leone or Guinea.

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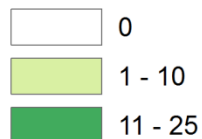

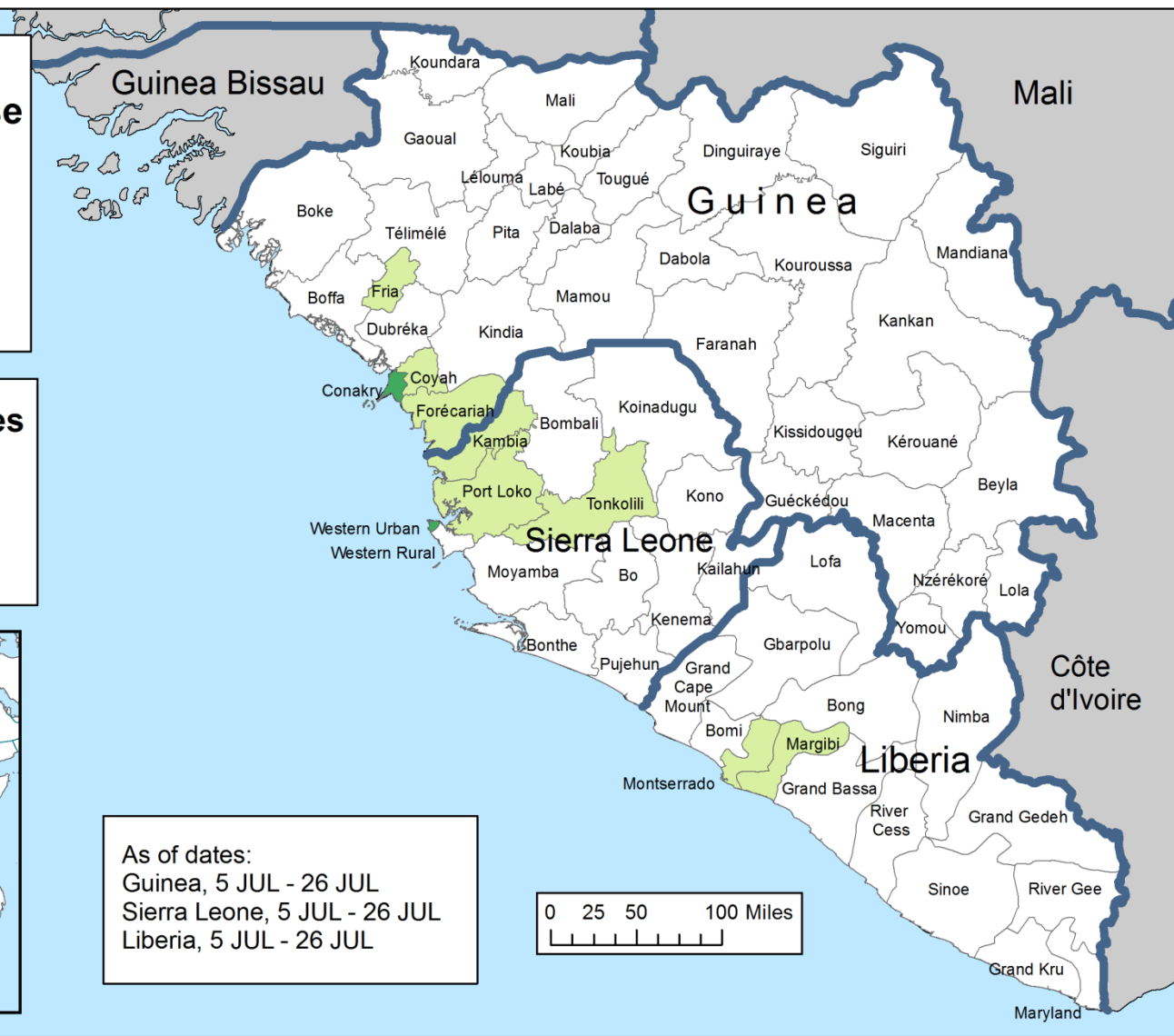
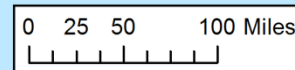


New confirmed Ebola virus disease cases by district in West Africa, during the most recently reported three-week period
