13 AUG 2015 (next report 20 AUG 2015)



CASE REPORT: According to [WHO on 12 AUG](#), between 3 and 9 AUG there was an increase of **three** confirmed and **64** suspected and/or probable Ebola virus disease (EVD) cases (+2 total deaths) in Guinea and Sierra Leone. **Sierra Leone also retrospectively reported a case from the week ending 2 AUG**. The total count of **27,965 cases (11,298 deaths)** includes past cases and deaths from Liberia, Italy, Senegal, Nigeria, the United States, Spain, Mali, and the United Kingdom.

Guinea reported **two new confirmed cases (one each from Conakry and Forecariah)**, up from **one** the previous week. Sierra Leone reported **one confirmed case (Western Urban Area)**, down from **two** the previous week (including the retrospectively reported case). **One of the Guinea cases was a registered contact of a known case that had been lost to follow up. This case had several high risk encounters with health care providers before diagnosis. The second case was diagnosed after death and may be linked to an unsafe burial. The Sierra Leone case was an eight month-old infant linked to a known chain of transmission but was not a registered contact.** Liberia has reported no new cases since 12 JUL and, barring additional cases, should be eligible for EVD transmission-free status on or about 4 SEP.

On 2 JUL, WHO's sixth [Emergency Committee meeting](#) on the 2014 EVD outbreak agreed that the outbreak continues to constitute a Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC) and that all previous recommendations remain in effect with some additions; the goal of zero transmission was emphasized.

DoD RESPONSE: On 18 MAY, CJCS specifically said Liberia is no longer an area of widespread EVD transmission and controlled monitoring will no longer be required for personnel returning from Liberia. As of 11 JUN, the 48th Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Brigade [completed their mission](#) as the joint forces' headquarters element providing oversight duties in Liberia. DoD personnel continue to provide support to the Liberian Institute of Biomedical Research. Other support efforts have transitioned to USAID, NIH and CDC.

DIAGNOSTICS AND MEDICAL COUNTERMEASURES: On 3 AUG, FDA granted an [Emergency Use Authorization](#) to OraSure Technologies for the [OraQuick Ebola Rapid Antigen Test](#). [Emergent BioSolutions](#) received a two-year, \$19.7 million task order from HHS on 20 JUL to continue developing its experimental monoclonal antibody therapy for Ebola. An interim analysis of the ring vaccination trial in Guinea suggests that the investigational rVSV-ZEBOV Ebola vaccine protects people exposed to EVD. USG AND GLOBAL RESPONSE: An [independent panel](#) reviewing the WHO's Ebola response said the health agency is incapable of adequately responding to a public health emergency and made several recommendations for change. Current information and guidance is available at the [CDC](#) and [WHO](#) Ebola web sites. [CDC published](#) a summary of the current published science about human-to-human transmission of Ebola virus on 23 JUL.

TRAVEL ADVISORY: The CDC is maintaining its [Warning - Level 3, Avoid Nonessential Travel](#) advisory for Guinea and Sierra Leone and [Warning - Level 2, Practice Enhanced Precautions](#) for Liberia despite the newly reported cases. [All flights carrying travelers from these three West African nations](#) must continue to enter the U.S. through one of five designated airports that are conducting enhanced screening for EVD (JFK, Newark Liberty, Washington Dulles, Chicago O'Hare, and Atlanta Hartsfield-Jackson). The CDC has [relaxed screening procedures](#) for passengers traveling from Liberia to the United States; for these travelers, airport temperature checks and the requirement for active monitoring were immediately discontinued. Personal health check kits (CARE kits) are still being distributed to these travelers. CDC continues to recommend that state public health departments [implement active post-arrival monitoring for 21 days](#) along with other movement restrictions based on a traveler's exposure risk category using CDC definitions; this restriction currently applies only to travelers from Sierra Leone or Guinea.

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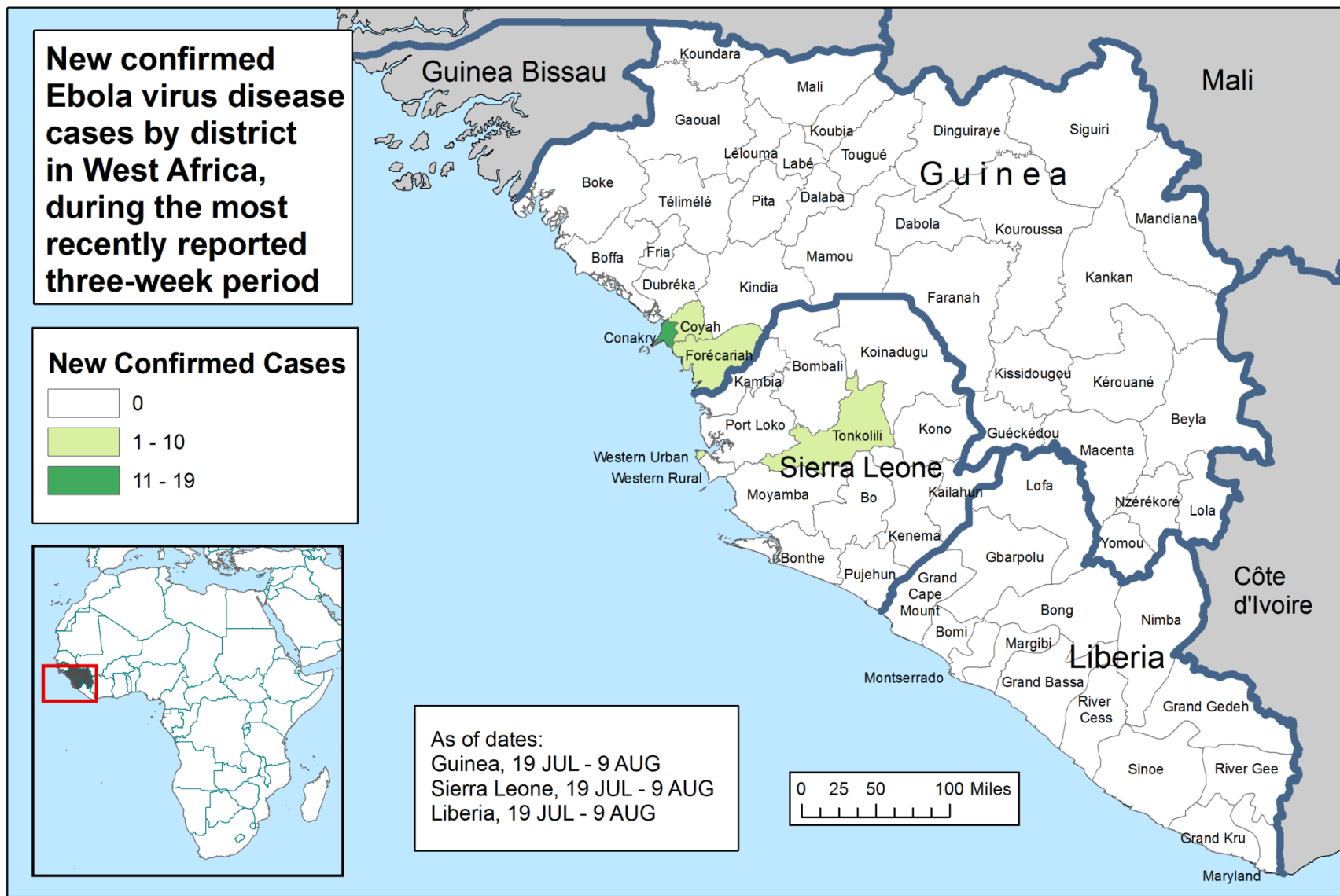
