Dear Mr. Chairman:

The Department's response to House Report 116-442, page 151, accompanying H.R. 6395, the William M. (Mac) Thornberry National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year (FY) 2021, on creative arts therapies, is enclosed.

This report summarizes current funding in support of the National Intrepid Center of Excellence (NICoE) and 10 Intrepid Spirit Centers (ISCs) during FY 2020-FY 2022, as well as what it would have cost had Creative Arts Therapies been expanded during FY 2022 at the NICoE, seven ISCs, and within interdisciplinary rehabilitation programs at three new locations.

Expansion of Creative Arts Therapy services and a number of Direct Care system locations at military medical treatment facilities has limited feasibility at this time. This is due to the limited available research evidence demonstrating effectiveness of Creative Arts Therapies, and current Defense Health Agency credentialing and privileging policies. The Department of Defense remains dedicated to fostering and sustaining collaborations focused on emerging interventions for the treatment of traumatic brain injury and posttraumatic stress disorder.

Thank you for your continued strong support for our Service members, civilian workforce, and families. I am sending a similar letter to the House Armed Services Committee.

The estimated cost of this report or study for the Department of Defense (DoD) is approximately \$7,100.00. This includes \$0.00 in expenses and \$7,100.00 in DoD labor.

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report is in response to House Report 116–442, page 151, accompanying H.R. 6395, the William M. (Mac) Thornberry National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year (FY) 2021, on the feasibility of expanding the Creative Arts Therapies program. House Report 116–442 requests that this report include the current funding and investment in Creative Arts Therapies at the National Intrepid Centers; the projected cost to expand Creative Arts Therapies; and the number of locations to which the program could be expanded.

Active duty Service members are at increased risk of physical and psychological trauma that may result in traumatic brain injury (TBI), posttraumatic stress disorder (PTSD), or both conditions. Among veterans with positive TBI screens, 80 percent show comorbid psychiatric conditions. Up to half of Service members with combat-related TBIs meet the criteria for PTSD.

The National Intrepid Center of Excellence (NICoE) and 10 Intrepid Spirit Centers (ISCs) received \$2,711,580.00 in FY 2020, \$2,891,577.00 in FY 2021, and \$2,960,933.00 in FY 2022 in Creative Arts Therapies program funding for a total of \$8,563,990.00. This funding supports current investments, levels of effort, positions, travel, supplies, and equipment. For purposes of providing an estimate for this report, estimates were provided based on a notional expansion of Creative Arts Therapy modalities at the NICoE, seven ISCs, and within interdisciplinary rehabilitation programs at three new locations. If the program had been expanded, Department of Defense (DoD) estimates it would have cost \$4,038,575.00 for FY 2022.

Based on the very limited availability of research evidence demonstrating the effectiveness of Creative Arts Therapies and review of current Defense Health Agency (DHA) credentialing and privileging policies, expanding Creative Arts Therapy services and the number of locations within the Direct Care system at military medical treatment facilities (MTFs) has limited feasibility at this time.

BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE

As of December 18, 2020, the Traumatic Brain Injury Center of Excellence identified 430,720 Service members who sustained a TBI during military service since 2000. The majority of these cases were classified as mild TBI (82.4 percent). The Psychological Health Center of Excellence analyzed 2019 DoD data using the average monthly population of active duty Service members, National Guard, and Reservists enrolled in TRICARE (1,519,803) and estimated a PTSD diagnosis prevalence rate of 1.79 percent (27,257) and an incidence rate of 1.11 percent (16,900) within this population. Active duty Service members are at increased risk of physical and psychological trauma that may result in TBI, PTSD, or both conditions. TBI involves an altered level of consciousness or disruption in cognitive functioning, memory loss, or neurological deficits. PTSD symptoms often overlap with TBI, causing anxiety, depression, cognitive deficits, irritability, and sleep disruptions. Among veterans with positive TBI screens, 80 percent show comorbid psychiatric conditions. Up to half of Service members with combat-related TBIs meet the criteria for PTSD.

The Creative Forces NEA Military Healing Arts Network is a Creative Arts Therapy initiative of the NEA in partnership with the DoD, Department of Veterans Affairs, and the State and local arts agencies for patients seen in MTFs that seeks to improve the health, wellness, and quality of life of military and veteran populations exposed to trauma, as well as their families and caregivers. Creative Arts Therapies encompass various creative and expressive art modalities aimed at improving an individual's psychological and social well-being, including, but not limited to, art, music, dance/movement, and creative writing. Creative Arts Therapies entail an expressive process that engages sensations, emotions, and cognition through verbal and non-verbal symbolization, narration, and expression of conflicts and meaning. Since Creative Arts Therapies consist of relatively new therapeutic approaches, it is difficult to attribute improvements in patient outcomes to Creative Arts Therapies or any other modality in isolation for patients seen in MTFs.

Art therapists are not recognized credentialed providers under either current Direct Care MTF policy or TRICARE policy. Therefore, if the DHA determines that Creative Arts Therapies are medically necessary and appropriate, an Interim and Final rule acknowledging Creative Arts Therapies as a separate benefit and provider category would need to be published prior to the expansions, if approved. This determination would be based on the demonstration that Creative Arts Therapies comprise proven medical care as assessed by a benefit determination, to be rendered by licensed/certified creative art therapists resulting from identified provider requirements under TRICARE policy for the private sector. Based on the very limited availability of research evidence demonstrating the effectiveness of Creative Arts Therapies and review of current DHA credentialing and privileging policies, expanding Creative Arts Therapy services and number of locations in the Direct Care system at MTFs has limited feasibility at this time.

RESULTS

National Intrepid Center of Excellence and Intrepid Spirit Centers

The NICoE and 10 ISCs received \$2,711,580.00 in FY 2020, \$2,891,577.00 in FY 2021, and \$2,960,933.00 in FY 2022 in Creative Arts Therapies program funding for a total of \$8,563,990.00. This funding supports current investments, levels of effort, positions, travel, supplies, and equipment. Table 1 summarizes total funding in support of current Creative Arts Therapies from FY 2020 to FY 2022 at NICoE and the ISCs. Appendix A includes the description of services, program funding, and funding source by site. Current program funds include internal and external dollars.

Future Locations/Sites/Clinics

Table 2 summarizes what it would have cost to expand Creative Arts Therapies program in 11 clinic locations in FY 2022. For purposes of providing an estimate for this report, estimates were provided based on a notional expansion of Creative Arts Therapy modalities at the NICoE, seven ISCs, and within interdisciplinary rehabilitation programs at three new locations. If the program had been expanded, the cost for the expansion of art, music, dance, and creative writing therapies would have been \$4,038,575.00 for FY 2022. Appendix B includes the an estimate of what would have been the cost of expanding services, program funding, and funding source by site. These estimates include transition of external contract funding to internal dollars for secured programing.

CONCLUSION

The DoD remains dedicated to fostering and sustaining collaborations with clinical and research partners in the area of emerging interventions for the treatment of TBI and PTSD, such as Creative Arts Therapies. Expansion of Creative Arts Therapy services and number of Direct Care system locations at MTFs has limited feasibility at this time. This is due to the limited available research evidence demonstrating effectiveness of Creative Arts Therapies, and current DHA credentialing and privileging policies. As part of an ongoing assessment, the DoD continues to incorporate data-driven decisions to integrate emerging and new therapies for the optimal treatment of TBI and PTSD.
